Conference Overview and Objectives

We would like to invite you to the 2011 West Virginia Trauma Symposium to be held at the Stonewall Resort, Roanoke, WV. This conference is designed for trauma surgeons, general surgeons, emergency room physicians, nurses, mid level providers and prehospital health care, coding specialists and health information professionals. A registrar workshop will be presented as a separate meeting during the closing day of the conference. All registrars working in the trauma arena are encouraged to attend. An eight-hour Trauma Nursing Workshop will be held on the opening day of the conference featuring topics on surgical trauma and complications. - Review the new surgical techniques in acetabulum/pelvic fractures

- Examine the role of embolization/stenting in the trauma patient
- Identify current treatment strategies of care for the palliative care patient
- Recognize trauma assessment guidelines in pancreatic/duodenal injuries
