Saturday & Sunday All Day Classes

Rope Rescue Awareness/Rope Rescue Operations - Low Angle (includes Fri. Eve.) This class will cover hazard recognition, equipment use, and techniques necessary to safely and effectively support and participate in a technical rescue from a low angle environment. *Appropriate dress required (helmet, eye protection, steel toe boots, long pants, and gloves)* Junior FF approved. Instructors-Ross Neff and Roger Shuttlesworth

Swift Water Operations - Designed for the river professional, this 2 day class is compliant to NFPA 1670 and provides the basics of river rescue. The emphasis is safety and self rescue, and topics include: reading water, recognizing and avoiding hazards, quick rescue techniques, and shore based operations. *Appropriate dress required (pfd, thermal suit, helmet, foot protection)* **Pre-requisites – Swift Water Awareness & Low Angle Ropes.** Instructor-Tom Klus

** Please note: Swift Water Awareness will be taught from 0900 to 1300 Saturday, April 10 in Parsons. People also are invited to a swift water exercise Saturday, April 24, in Otter Creek Wilderness. E-mail Tom Klus at tchsmathman@yahoo.com for more information.*

Vehicle Machinery Search & Rescue – Awareness and Operations; Auto Extrication- This hands-on course will go beyond the basic skills acquired in Basic Auto Extrication concentrating on problem solving and using advanced tools. NFPA 1670. *Bunker gear required.* Junior FF approved. Instructors-Rick and Darlene Scott

Rural Water Movement- Providing and sustaining big water in areas without pressurized hydrant systems. Junior FF approved. Instructor-Jay Parsons

Propane Emergencies- This class is designed to give the firefighter/first responder, “hands on” experience in dealing with propane emergencies including live fires. This class will require the student to extinguish propane fire in real type scenarios using skills taught in the awareness and classroom part of the operations course. This class is designed to meet the NFPA 58 Operations - Mission Specific - Level for responding to and dealing with propane emergencies. The nationally recognized instructors will challenge students and allow them to experience the potential dangers of fighting propane fires designed around realistic scenarios. *Bunker gear required. SCBA will be worn and there will be no facial hair permitted.* Instructor-Dennis Cruise, outreach coordinator, Virginia Propane Gas Association; Hazardous Materials Technician; Instructor Virginia Department of Emergency Management, Virginia Department of Fire Programs and recognized by the WV Fire Commission as a subject matter expert in Propane Emergencies.



Eight Hour Saturday Classes

NIMS 300 (includes all day Friday)- This course provides training on and resources for personnel who require advanced application of the Incident Command System (ICS). The target audience includes all individuals who may assume a supervisory role in expanding incidents. *Pre-requisite – NIMS 100 & 200* Instructor- Larry Allen

HazMat IQ- This one day training course teaches responders to rapidly enter the hot zone while wearing turn out gear and self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA), and operating direct reading instruments (meters) to take immediate action, including making a rescue. All of the concepts presented are with the safety of first responders in mind in conjunction with proven risk-based procedures. This training is perfect for departments that do not have a hazmat team nearby, or a department with a hazmat team that wants to enhance the capabilities of their first arriving units. Additionally, each student will receive a NIOSH Pocket Guide to Chemical Hazards and a set of laminated HazMat IQ FRO Smart Charts™ to augment their learning. This class Meets NFPA 472 “mission specific” competence for rescue/recon, air monitoring, and personnel protective equipment

Mass Casualty Incident- This course includes Module I and Module II of the West Virginia Mass Casualty Incidents Course. It is required for certification and re-certification for First Responders, EMTs and Paramedics. Junior FF approved. Instructor-Lynda Gray

Eight Hour Sunday Class

NIMS 400- This course provides training on and resources for personnel who require advanced application of the Incident Command System (ICS). The target audience for this course is senior personnel who are expected to perform in a management capacity in an Area Command or Multi-agency Coordination Entity. *Pre-requisite – NIMS 100, 200 & 300* Instructor-Larry Allen



Four Hour Sunday Classes

MORNING: Clandestine Meth Lab Recognition and Response- This course is for the benefit of first responders who may encounter a clandestine methamphetamine lab process. This course will cover the components of the lab process, elements of risk, hazards associated, and understanding the risks associated with the components of the clandestine labs along with protecting yourself and others. Junior FF approved. Instructors-Sgt. Kevin Keplinger, West Virginia State Police & Mike Dorsey, WVDEP

AFTERNOON: Explosive Recognition for Public Safety Officers- An introduction to the hazards of explosive terrorist devices, recognition of different types of explosive devices, common terminology, and hazards to personnel. It may include detonation of a device as part of out-of-class activity. Instructor-Sgt. Kevin Keplinger, West Virginia State Police

MORNING: HazMat Awareness- Designed for first responders to identify Hazardous Materials and how to use the Emergency Response Guidelines and basic knowledge of transportation vehicles when they see them. Junior FF approved. Instructor-Lynda Gray

AFTERNOON: EMT Spinal Immobilizations- EMT Protocol 6103 Trauma: Spinal Immobilization. This class will offer a review of the protocol with hands-on practice of immobilization techniques in a variety of settings. This course meets the 4 hour requirement for EMT-B continuing education/refresher training in either the trauma or elective topics. Instructors-Hollis Lipscomb and Lynda Gray
