“Children Are Not Small Adults”

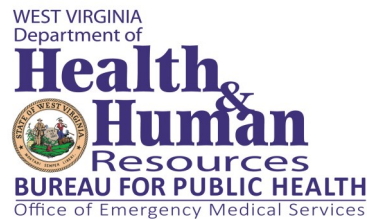
